Description of the position: The Special Laboratory Primate Neurobiology Laboratory at the Leibniz Institute for Neurobiology (LIN) in Magdeburg has an immediate opening for an electrophysiologist at the pre- or post-doctoral level. We study the neural bases of audition using a variety of research methods, including behavioral testing, multielectrode recordings from awake behaving macaque monkeys, psychophysics, and deep brain stimulation. Our laboratory is one of several highly collegial and interactive groups at the LIN and the Otto-von-Guerricke Universität in Magdeburg that study neural mechanisms underlying audition and learning and memory with a large variety of research methods.
